Peer review processes for the comprehensive regional assessment included:

- Comprehensive Regional Assessment Implementation Forum (CRAIF), with representatives from all States and the Commonwealth, was established to develop CRA methodologies
- Seminars and workshops used in project development
- Project management group and Steering Committee, both involving multiple government agencies involved in project approval
- Project management group managed each project
- Reports reviewed by project management group, technical experts and Steering Committee
- Panel of Independent Scientists and Experts to advised on vegetation mapping
- Outcomes from Panels of Experts in other RFAs were used in the development of methods for Western Australian
- Independent Expert Advisory Group undertook assessment of Ecologically Sustainable Forest Management (ESFM)
- ESFM recommendations released for two rounds of public consultation
- Panel of Experts undertook World Heritage Assessment
- National Social Assessment Expert Panel reviewed and provided feedback on social assessment projects
- Australian Heritage Commission - Western Australian Natural Environment Panel provided feedback on National Estate assessments
