

# Rare flora of the Geraldton-Greenough area

These rare species are found in very small numbers at only a few locations. They are threatened by land clearing, drought, weed invasion and grazing.

**Long-flowered nancy**  
(*Wurmbea tubulosa*)



**Habitat** River banks and seasonally wet places  
**Description** A herb 10 to 30 centimetres tall  
**Flowering time** June to August

**Irwin's conostylis**  
(*Conostylis dielsii* subsp. *teres*)



**Habitat** Heath, scrub and low open woodland  
**Description** A herb 13 to 33 centimetres tall  
**Flowering time** July to August

**Bracted grevillea**  
(*Grevillea bracteosa*)



**Habitat** Among trees or in heathland on gravelly soil or sand  
**Description** A shrub 0.5 to two metres tall  
**Flowering time** August to October

**Thick-margined leucopogon**  
(*Leucopogon marginatus*)



**Habitat** Shrubland and heath  
**Description** A shrub 0.4 to one metre tall  
**Flowering time** July to August

**Small-flowered conostylis**  
(*Conostylis micrantha*)



**Habitat** Sandplain heathland  
**Description** A herb 13 to 24 centimetres tall  
**Flowering time** July to August

**Kalbarri spider orchid**  
(*Caladenia wanosa*)



**Habitat** Sandstone outcrops, the top edges of gorges and open woodland  
**Description** An orchid three to eight centimetres tall  
**Flowering time** August to September

**Kneeling hammer orchid**  
(*Drakaea concolor*)



**Habitat** Open areas among thick scrub and low, dense heath and in damp depressions  
**Description** An orchid 25 to 30 centimetres tall  
**Flowering time** August to September
