

Rare flora of the Mingenev area

These rare species are found in very small numbers at only a few locations. They are threatened by land clearing, drought, weed invasion and grazing.

Scaly-leaved featherflower (*Verticordia spicata* subsp. *squamosa*)



Habitat Tall shrubland on sandplains
Description A shrub to one metre tall
Flowering time November to December

Beautiful daviesia (*Daviesia speciosa*)



Habitat Dense low shrubland on gravelly soils
Description A shrub 30 to 80 centimetres tall
Flowering time April to May

Mingenev everlasting (*Schoenia filifolia* subsp. *subulifolia*)



Habitat Swampy flats and crabholes
Description A herb to 50 centimetres tall
Flowering time September to October

Long-flowered nancy (*Wurmbea tubulosa*)



Habitat River banks and seasonally wet places
Description A herb 10 to 30 centimetres tall
Flowering time June to August

Drummond's glyceria (*Glyceria drummondii*)



Habitat Localised hollows in claypans in seasonally flooded areas
Description Grass
Flowering time July to October

Shell-fruited grevillea (*Grevillea murex*)



Habitat Tall shrubland or woodland
Description Shrub one to 2.5 metres tall
Flowering time July to October
